9th Annual Give Back Iowa Challenge Winners Announced

Des Moines, IA - Volunteer Iowa is pleased to announce the winners of the 9th Annual Give Back Iowa Challenge, a campaign in which businesses encourage their employees to volunteer and log their hours as part of a statewide competition. This year, the challenge ran from April 1 – May 31 across the state of Iowa.

From a business perspective, employer supported volunteering impacts the bottom line. Studies show it leads to improved employee engagement, organizational commitment, job satisfaction, and retention. From an engagement perspective, places of employment are perfect environments to encourage and support volunteering efforts that contribute toward meeting significant community challenges.

The benefits of volunteering in the workplace are undeniably far reaching, improving not only the lives of those who directly receive the community assistance, but of those who get involved in the impact. One study shows us that employees who volunteer at work report five times higher well-being, 89% increased job satisfaction, and overall higher levels of engagement and satisfaction in their respective workplaces.

"While volunteer rates have declined since the start of the pandemic, we continue to see an increased need for volunteers statewide. The Give Back Iowa Challenge is a tool employers use to engage their employees in volunteering," Volunteer Iowa Executive Director Adam Lounsbury said. "We are encouraged to see that more businesses participated in the challenge this year, as they work to meet the needs of their communities."

Participating employers were divided into three categories based on the number of employees. Winners were selected by the highest average number of volunteer hours per employee. The 2023 winners are:

- Small: Community Youth Concepts (CYC), Des Moines Honorable Mention: CENT Credit Union, Mason City
- Mid-sized: Bankers Trust, Des Moines
 Honorable Mention: First Citizens Bank, Mason City
- Large: Riverside Casino and Golf Resort, Riverside
 Honorable Mention: ITA Group, West Des Moines

This year's winning employers commented on the importance of work-based volunteering and participation in the Give Back Iowa Challenge:
